#### **Distillery District:**

Markets follow the Ontario harvest and run certain Sundays from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., including May 9 and 16, June 13 and 27, July 4 and 11, July 25, Aug. 1, 8 and 15, Sept. 5, 19 and 26, and Oct. 10. Details: 55 Mill St. (Lake Shore Blvd. E. and Parliament St. area), the distillery district.com. Perks: Music and all-day breakfasts at the Farmers' Market Grill.

# **Dufferin Grove:**

This year-round market runs Thursdays from 3:30 to 7 p.m. Details: Dufferin Grove Park rink house (across from Dufferin Mall), dufferinpark.ca. Perks: Organics, meat, fish, game, prepared food, community oven bread and a weekly e-mail bulletin that previews the goods.

Riverdale Farm Organic:

Tuesdays from 3 to 7 p.m. between May 4 and Oct. 26. Details: Riverdale Park East in front of Riverdale Farm in Cabbagetown, friendsofriverdalefarm.com. Perks: Ontario growers and producers, local small-scale manufacturers, community wood-fired oven. Everything is organic and local except Fair Trade coffee and organic olive oil from one vendor's farm in Greece.

Sherway Gardens:

Fridays from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. between May 7 and Oct. 29. Details: Sherway Gardens Shopping Centre, 25 The West Mall, Etobicoke, sherwaygardens.ca, north parking lot across from door three. Perks: More than 15 vendors, with pies, preserves, cheese, deli meats, bread, flowers.

Streetsville:

Village Market:

Perks: 28 regular vendors, including six farmers. Organic food, usually local, milk, yogurt, beef, chicken and salami.

Barrie:

Beaverton:

Cambridge:

Saturdays from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. year-round., plus Wednesdays from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. from June until September. Details: Corner of Ainslie and Dickson Sts., 519-740-4690, ext. 4252. Perks: Operating since 1830. Entertainment, demonstrations, up to 54 farm produce vendors plus others selling meat, cheese, eggs, bread.
