

Consultation on minimum antibiotic withdrawal times (Dairy)

At the present time there are a range of standards governing the withdrawal times for antibiotic use in dairy animals in Canada depending on the region and the certifying body:

British Columbia	- (COABC) – 30 days
Ontario	- (OCPP –Pro Cert) – lifetime
Quebec	- 14 days

Individual farms may certify to other standards than the dominant one in their province as listed above.

The Organic Council of Ontario has been advised of the confusion being caused by this situation and is conducting a poll to determine the position of those affected.

The Canadian Standard now stands at 14 days and is being reviewed by the Livestock Working Group of the Technical Standards Committee. OCO recognizes the importance of this issue and will use the results of this poll to advise their representative on the committee.
