Message to Premier McGuinty: ELECTRIC trains now!

The provincial government is proposing a scheme which would expand the use of diesel trains now and introduce electric trains many years from now. The government's plan is widely opposed for many reasons.

Opting for more diesels would:

- Expose our communities to the pollution and noise of more diesel trains,
- Delay the introduction of electric trains which are much more versatile and can integrate much more effectively with the TTC
- Require the construction of a massive, oppressive and costly 10 km concrete wall through our neighbourhoods to reduce the noise of the diesels. (Electric trains are quieter and would not require the wall.)
- Waste tax dollars on a diesel scheme which would cost much more than electric on the long run.

The Clean Train Coalition calls on Premier McGuinty to scrap plans to expand the use of diesels. Our message is clear: Expanding diesel now and going electric later makes no sense. Electrify the rail corridor NOW! Do it once and do it right!

Private operator backs out of link to Pearson Airport

In a major development, SNC Lavalin has pulled out of plans for a privately-owned rail link between Pearson Airport and Union Station. With SNC Lavalin no longer in the mix, electrification is now an issue between the people and the provincial government – and the people have spoken.
